In an effort to divert non-edible food waste from local landfills, ReWorks is working towards connecting generators of food waste, (e.g. vegetables, fruits, coffee grounds, egg shells, etc., excluding meat) that can be donated to community gardens to be composted. - Garden must be located in Summit County
- Must be a community garden
- Must have been in existence last year and completed one full growing season
- Must commit to have a working garden in 2017
- Must have garden ready for compost by 3rd week in May
- Cannot be a household/residential garden
- Only 1 submission per garden
- Prior year's winners are not eligible
